HOW TO ENTER THE FAIR

Adult and Junior entries form located at back of Exhibitor's Catalog are to be duplicated. One Exhibitor's Catalog per family.

1. ADULT DEPARTMENT

Use separate entry form for each department or category. (i.e., one for Agriculture & Horticulture, one for Floriculture potted plants & cut flowers, one for Wed. & Sat. Arrangements, one for Baked Foods, another for Clothing, another for preserved foods; one for Arts, another for Crafts, and another for Photography)

2. JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

- A) Use separate form for each department (i.e., one for Agriculture, Horticulture, Potted Plants; one for all Home Economics; one for Miscellaneous and Ag Mechanics; and one for Arts, Crafts and Photography)
- B) Pre-school exhibitor must use age as of July 1 to determine which section to enter. For office use, please put date of birth on form.

K thru 12 use grade completed at end of this school year (June 2010). For office use, please put date of birth on form.

C) Form requires signature of junior exhibitors:

Age 3 thru K - Parents signature only

Grades 1 thru 3, Exhibitor may print name - Parents or Guardian must also sign.

Grades 4 thru 12, Exhibitor signs in cursive - Parents or Guardian must also sign.

- 3. New Exhibitors, please check "New Exhibitor Box" for convenience of Office Staff. Old Exhibitors, please check "Change of Address Box" if you have moved.
- 4. Entry **FORMS** are to be in Fair office or postmarked on or before entry form due date. (**NOTE:** Entry closing dates vary for different Departments.)
- 5. **CHECK THIS EXHIBITOR'S CATALOG UNDER APPROPRIATE DEPARTMENT HEADINGS FOR THE DATES AND THE TIMES EXHIBITS ARE TO BE BROUGHT TO THE FAIRGROUNDS AND ALSO TIMES TO BE PICKED UP AFTER FAIR. (IF UNABLE TO PICK UP EXHIBITS, YOU MAY HAVE SOMEONE ELSE PICK THEM UP FOR YOU. BE SURE THEY HAVE THE EXHIBITOR CLAIM STUBS.)**

Each exhibitor is responsible for the accuracy and correctness of his entry form, and awards could be disallowed in case of errors. The fairgrounds staff is happy to be of assistance and can be contacted weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. by phone (530) 402-2222 or in person. New exhibitors are especially encouraged to ask for assistance.

FAIR MANAGEMENT IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR FINDING ERRORS ON EXHIBITOR'S ENTRIES

State Rules are available in Fair Office.

1. Unless otherwise designated, all open departments exhibits are limited to residents of Colusa, Solano, Sutter, Yuba and Yolo Counties.
2. Check department-section information carefully for entry closing dates, receiving dates and release dates. Absolutely no entries will be accepted after closing dates. When applicable, entry fees must accompany entry form. There will be no refund of fees regardless of circumstances. If the check for the entry fee is refused by the bank, a penalty of \$25.00 per check must be paid before the judging of the class(es) of entry.
3. All entry forms will be accepted any time after publication of this Exhibitor's Catalog. All forms must be received by designated deadline as stated in department-sections at Fair Office either in person or by mail (which would be greatly appreciated by Fair staff). Entry Office Hours: 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays.
4. The following definitions are important to the understanding of this Exhibitor's Catalog.
 - A. System of Judging:
 1. American System: The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc. if merited.
 2. Danish System: The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placing, etc, as merited.
 - B. Exhibitor - The owner of the exhibit. Either the sole owner or a designated exhibiting owner.
 - C. Exhibit - An object or collection of objects entered in a class.
 - D. Entry - An eligible exhibit which is entered and judged.
5. List only one entry per line on the entry form.
6. **YOLO COUNTY FAIR MANAGEMENT** reserves the right to screen, reject entirely, or accept conditionally, any exhibit that, in management's opinion, may be in questionable taste for the general fair and attending public.
7. Upon signature and submittal of entry form (**NO FAX SIGNATURES WILL BE ACCEPTED**), exhibitors and their agents, parents, leaders acknowledge that: a) They understand the State Rules and the local fair rules; b) They agree to abide by them; c) They certify that all information on the form is true and correct; d) They agree to comply with the fair's decision regarding any violation of the rules, and e) In the case of established unethical treatment of animals or violation of drug policy rules, exhibitor's name will be forwarded to Fairs and Expositions.
8. a) Proper precautions will be taken for the protection of the exhibits, but Yolo County Fair or its representatives will not be responsible for loss by fire, theft or otherwise.
b) The Exhibitor agrees to indemnify and save harmless Association and the State of California, their officers, servants and employees from any and all claims, resulting from any damages, injury or loss to any person or persons, including all persons to whom the Exhibitor may be liable under any Worker's Compensation law and Exhibitor himself and from any loss, damage, cause of action, claims or suits for damages including, but not limited to, loss of property, goods, caused by, arising out of or in any way connected with the exercise by Exhibitor of the privileges herein granted.
9. Premiums (cash awards) are paid only in accordance with results recorded on the judge's sheets. Tags, ribbons, etc. have no value as to payment of premiums.
10. **Premium checks must be cashed within six (6) months of date issued.**
11. All ribbons (with the exception of those given at the time of judging) will be given out when entries are released.
12. For the protection of exhibitors **NO ENTRIES** will be removed on the Closing Night of the Fair. Refer to Individual Departments for release times. **NO EXHIBITS WILL BE KEPT AFTER 8:00 P.M., MONDAY, AUGUST 23.**

MAIN ENTRANCE

TRAVELING EAST ON INTERSTATE 80:

Interstate 80 East to the Woodland off ramp (Hwy. 113). Take Gibson Road turn off. Turn left onto Gibson Road. At Matmor signal turn right. Go to Gum Avenue (stop sign). Turn left onto Gum Avenue and proceed west to main entrance on left.

Take Interstate 5 North and take the first Woodland off ramp, turn left and follow E. Main Street thru town. Turn left on East Street. Go to Gum Avenue and turn left at signal proceed east to main entrance on right.

TRAVELING SOUTH ON INTERSTATE 5:

Interstate 5 take Highway 113 (Main Street). Stay on 113 and take Gibson Road turn off. Turn right at Matmor signal and go to Gum Avenue (stop sign). Turn left onto Gum and proceed west to the main entrance on left.

COUNTY, COMMUNITY & ORGANIZATIONS EXHIBITS

Entry blanks for Feature Exhibits (Booths) should indicate the approximate number of square feet required for the display and should be filed sufficiently early to enable the fair management to allocate necessary space in the exhibit building.

1. Feature Exhibits (Booths) shall be limited to one entry by or for a county, community, organization or non-commercial entry in this Department.

Exhibits (Booths) must be maintained for the duration of the fair. "NEW" Back Lot Parking Pass fee will be \$20.00 per pass.

All booths will have a minimum of a 6 foot back wall and 4 foot side wall. Booths must be cleared of all staples and tacks in side walls when dismantled.

NOTE: For all classes in this Department. Booths shall be reserved only when the Fair Office has received the proper entry form and entry fee.

FIRE PREVENTION -All material and decorations must be flameproofed and are subject to inspection by the fire marshal. Flame proofing can be bought at Fire Safe on Kentucky Avenue.

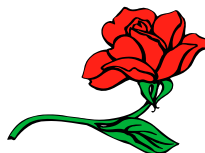

Coat three 9-in. round baking pans with nonstick cooking spray and sprinkle with flour; set aside. In a mixing bowl, beat butter and sugar until crumbly, about 2 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in vanilla. Combine the flour, cocoa, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with buttermilk. Add water; mix well. Pour into prepared pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes; remove from pans to wire racks to cool completely.

For frosting, in a heavy saucepan, combine the sugar, egg whites, water, corn syrup and cream of tartar. With a portable mixer, beat mixture on low speed for 1 minute. Continue beating on low over low heat until candy thermometer reads 160 degrees, about 5 minutes. Pour into a large mixing bowl; add extracts. Beat on high until stiff peaks form, about 7 minutes. Spread frosting between layers and over top and sides of cake.

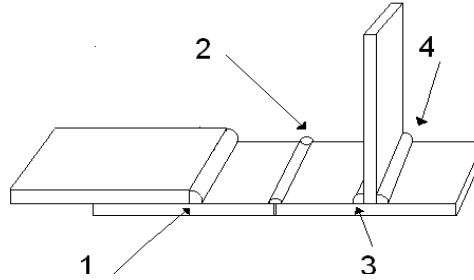
