FAIR MANAGEMENT IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR FINDING ERRORS ON EXHIBITOR'S ENTRIES

State Rules are available in Fair Office or may be viewed on the Internet at www.cdfa.ca.gov/fairs.

1. Unless otherwise designated, all open section exhibits are limited to residents of Colusa, Solano, Sutter, Yuba, and Yolo Counties.
2. Check department-section information carefully for entry closing dates and release dates. Absolutely no entries will be accepted after closing dates. When applicable, entry fees must accompany entry form. There will be no refund of fees regardless of circumstances. If the check for the entry fee is refused by the bank, a penalty of \$25.00 per check must be paid by money order or cash, before the judging of the class(es) of entry.
3. All entry forms must be received by the designated deadline as stated in department-section either in person or by mail (1125 East Street, Woodland, CA 95776). Entry Office Hours: 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays.
4. The following definitions are important to the understanding of this Exhibitors Catalog.
 - A. System of Judging:
 1. American System: The judging process to rank exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc. if merited.
 2. Danish System: The judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placing, etc., as merited.
 - B. Exhibitor - The owner of the exhibit.
 - C. Entry - An object, animal or collection of objects or animals intended for exhibit.
 - D. Exhibit - An entry becomes an exhibit when it is shown or judged at the fair.
5. List only one entry per line on the entry form (Entry Forms may be duplicated).
6. **YOLO COUNTY FAIR MANAGEMENT** reserves the right to screen, reject entirely, or accept conditionally, any exhibit that, in management's opinion, may be in questionable taste for the general fair and attending public.
7. By signing and submitting of entry form, exhibitors and their agents, parents, and leaders acknowledge and agree that they: a) Understand and have read the State Rules and local fair rules; b) Agree to abide by them; c) Certify that all information on the form is true and accurate; and d) Agree to comply with the fair's decision regarding any alleged violation of the state or local rules. In the event that it is determined there has been unethical treatment of animals or violation of state or federal regulations or of state or local fair drug policy rules, exhibitor names will be forwarded to F&E as well as given to the Network of California fairs and to appropriate government agencies as prescribed in State Rules.
8. a) Proper precautions will be taken for the protection of the exhibits, but Yolo County Fair or its representatives are not responsible for loss by fire, theft or otherwise.
b) The Exhibitor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Association and the State of California, their officers, servants and employees from any and all claims, resulting from any damages, injury or loss to any person or persons, including all persons to whom the Exhibitor may be liable under any Worker's Compensation law and Exhibitor himself and from any loss, damage, cause of action, claims or suits for damages, including but not limited to loss of property, goods, caused by, arising out of or in anyway connected with the exercise by Exhibitor of the privileges herein granted.
9. Premiums (cash awards) are paid only in accordance with results recorded on the judge's sheets. Ribbons, etc. have no value as to payment of premiums.
10. Checks for premiums will be mailed to the address of the exhibitor as recorded on entry forms, as soon after the close of fair as possible.
11. **Premium checks must be cashed** within ninety days of date issued.

NOTICE TO SENIOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

There will be a twenty-five (\$25.00) dollar trailer/tent space fee for the 5-day fair. In order to reserve your space, the \$25.00 fee must accompany entry form. There are 5 spaces available on a first-come basis. Exhibitor **MUST** come to Livestock office to get trailer pass.

BE SURE YOU HAVE YOUR BREEDING PAPERS CHECKED BY LIVESTOCK STAFF THE DAY BEFORE JUDGING.

Livestock Local Rules

All Exhibitors are expected to read and abide by the following Rules:

1. Open Jr. exhibitors must be at least 5 years of age by Jan. 1, 2010 & must be able to control animals.
2. All cattle must be broken to lead.
3. All LIVESTOCK, RABBITS, CATFISH & BIRDS will remain on the grounds until 12:00 Noon, Sunday, August 22, **with the exception of Sr. Dairy Goats who may leave at the conclusion of Judging on Friday, August 20.**
4. Management cannot be held responsible for necessary changes in order of events.
5. All animals, pens, and stalls must be cleaned before 9:00 a.m. each day.
6. The first bedding of straw for Senior Exhibitors Only will be furnished by the Fair Association. Additional beddings may be purchased on the grounds.
7. The management reserves the right to limit the number of exhibitors per breed and/or the number of animals per breed.
8. Any person tampering with the livestock of another exhibitor will have his/her premium forfeited and will be evicted from the grounds.
8. Any person tampering with stall assignments without approval of the Livestock Office will be asked to **leave the grounds** and premiums will be forfeited.
10. **Parking Pass**
All Livestock Exhibitors will be charged \$15.00 for a Parking Pass, non refundable. Open Goat Exhibitors who are coming in on Thursday and leaving on Friday will pay \$5.00 for a one-day parking pass. FFA Exhibitor's Pass will be limited as to days and times as directed by Fair CEO and Livestock Staff.
11. **FFA ADVISORS' PARKING:**
Each School will be allotted 2 assigned parking spaces in the parking lot. No parking on inner grounds.

Protests

1. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weighmasters, tail dock officials and timers cannot be protested and are final.
2. Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of either **\$100.00** (cash, money order or certified check made payable to the fair) or **\$200.00** if the protest relates to violations of State Rules X-XI (Animal Health Rules.) NOTE: The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. If the protest is upheld, the violator may be held liable for any portion of the direct costs incurred by the fair in the course of the protest resolution. Failure to reimburse the fair shall be caused for disallowing future entries in any of the network of California fairs.
3. Given the short duration of the fair:
 - a. The protestor shall make every effort to file the protest prior to judging. **All protests must be filed with-in 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest and before conclusion of fair.**
 - b. The fair will make every effort to resolve protests as quickly as possible. All exhibitors by entering an exhibit and all persons by filling a protest agree to cooperate with fair management to resolve protests in a timely manner.
 - c. Protests shall be adjudicated by Fair Management and/or members of Board of Directors.

Excerpts from State Rules regarding Junior Exhibitors:

VII Junior Department

Senior Department Restrictions

22. Junior exhibitors and junior organizations may be allowed to enter exhibits in senior department classes for which they are eligible only when:
 - a. "All Other" classes are not available; or
 - b. A class for the exhibit is not provided in the junior department or;
 - c. It allows participation in featured breed and/or sponsored association shows as defined by fair management. The junior exhibitor must also exhibit the project in the junior division.
The junior exhibitor is not eligible to exhibit in the junior department
24. Animals entered as individuals in the junior department cannot be entered in group classes of the senior department and vice versa.
25. When violations to rules 22-24 occur the junior exhibitor is not eligible for 12 months following the infraction to exhibit in that livestock species or division (non-livestock) as a junior at any state-supported fair.

Livestock Exhibits Ownership

27. Under no circumstances may an exhibitor concurrently enter the same species of animal or bird (horses, beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, dairy goats, meat goats, pygmy goats, poultry, pigeons, or rabbits) in FFA, 4H, Grange, and *Independent* classes of the junior department.
29. No junior exhibitor may exhibit an animal in a market class once it has been sold as a market animal through a fair junior livestock auction. These animals may be shown following the 30 consecutive day ownership requirement as breeding animals. *All champion and reserve champion market animals will be permanently identified by the fair if sold through a fair junior livestock auction.*
30. Livestock shown in showmanship must be owned by the exhibitor and entered by the exhibitor in an appropriate market or breeding class.

Livestock - Other

32. Junior Exhibitors are expected to groom and care for their animal(s) when at the fair. They shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction. Local fair rules will determine enforcement.
34. Junior exhibitors shall not have animals on exhibit in the senior and/or junior department at more than one state-supported fair at the same time. **This includes California State Fair. Please contact Yolo County Fair Office if you desire a waiver to the rule.**
